About us:

The Futuros Empresarios (FE) Program is a community initiative of The Hispanic Chamber of Commerce of the Lehigh Valley. Since 2009, we have partnered with local colleges, universities, businesses and other private sponsors to deliver educational, comprehensive life skills and entrepreneurial training to high school students of the Lehigh Valley.

Each year we select over 30 students and provide them with an opportunity to learn, explore and discover their career interests.

What we do:

The vision of the Fé Foundation of the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce of the Lehigh Valley is to increase the rate of educational, economic, and social success of underserved or underrepresented students in order to transform our community.

Who should participate:

We are seeking 10th and 11th grade Latino students who are interested in life skills and academic business training at DeSales University and a paid internship with local businesses over the summer. This is a five week program that will begin in late June.

What we expect:

Our Corporate and Community partners who invite our FE Program interns to become part their team expect the same level of professionalism from their interns as they do of their employees. Reliability, trust, good communication skills, personal accountability and a desire to do good work are some of character traits that every intern must exhibit, and be committed to, as part of the FE Program.

FE Program highlights:

The program includes one week of life skills and academic business training at DeSales University. While at DeSales, students will reside on campus and get a view of campus life. Upon conclusion of the academic portion of the program, we will match the students with local businesses and organizations for internships where mentors share real-life business challenges and opportunities. The students must provide their own transportation to these internships. After completion of the internship, on graduation day the students will be paid a stipend.

This program is at no cost to the students and is funded by the generosity of local businesses, colleges, universities and other private sponsors.

Added benefits:

In addition, selected students will be able to participate in the Fé Foundation's Math Enrichment Program (SAT Prep) in the winter and the Textbook Scholarship program in the spring for college/trade school bound students.
