Intern Opportunities

Intern/cooperative associates at PPL work alongside industry professionals in a program designed to give students practical work experience and increase their professional abilities and skills in their field of study. Full-time and part-time competitively paid opportunities are available throughout the year.

The intern/co-op program helps students determine career interests and gain exposure to a corporate environment while gaining practical skills and experience to supplement their work in the classroom.

To qualify, you must:

- Be enrolled in an accredited four-year college or university program.
- Be enrolled on a full-time basis as determined by the college or university (12 semester hours).
- Have an acceptable overall grade point average, not lower than a 3.0.
- Be eligible to work in accordance with Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services regulations.
- Be able to provide an official student transcript and other required information.
- Be 18 years of age or older.

Intern/co-op opportunities are available for various fields of study. PPL has arranged with local colleges to provide affordable housing options for summer interns/co-ops, both on-campus and off-campus.

- meet the basic qualifications
 - Enrolled in a curriculum leading to a baccalaureate or masters degree in Engineering from a college or university accredited by ABET or recognized by ABET as substantially equivalent.
 - Enrolled on a full-time basis (12 semester hours). Students may not continue as an Intern/Co-operative Associate once they have graduated.
 - Have an acceptable overall (cumulative) grade point average, not lower than a 3.0.
 - Eligible to work in accordance with Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services (BCIS) regulations.
 - Able to provide an official student transcript and other required information.
 - 18 years of age or older.
